Theatre in Education Program

Introduction:

The main and sole purpose of education is to help students learn and make that learning permanent. It can be done only when the students themselves participate actively with full of their interest in the teaching-learning process. The purpose of overall personality development necessitates the inclusion of functional activities. **Theatre in Education** is an innovative approach to such kind of interactive learning. It is based on child psychology so it makes students active, enthusiastic and creative. It is an effort to help students reach new heights, see new horizon through making them more receptive to learning and much aware of their endless capabilities.

Thus BNKVS Group of Theatre Society started TiE Program by the support of Raj WestPower Limited in schools and community groups of Barmer. Hence there were two parts of the TiE Program-

- TiE for Schools
- TiE for Community

Program Objectives:

(TiE For Schools)

The overall objective of the TiE program is to improve the quality of education amongst target schools/children. The specific objectives of the program are:

- To remove monotony of classroom teaching
- To Improve teacher-student interaction
- To make learning interactive and joyful
- To increase the power of expression of students
- To impart theatrical training to teachers as part of their teaching aids
- To sensitize teachers towards the concept of joyful learning

(TiE For Community Awareness)

- Social issues/problems hampering the progress in general will be identified as the theme.
- Generate awareness on social evils like illiteracy, child marriage, child labour, discrimination towards girl child, substance abuse etc.
- Sensitise people on social issues which are at the same time relevant for business like driving and general safety, environmental awareness, water conservation etc.
- Such theatres will be educative as well as entertaining, participatory as well as an expression of local art forms thus generating curiosity and resultant goodwill.

Methodology:

(For Schools)

4 trained Resource Persons (RPs) of BNKVS went to the identified schools and organized a 4-day TiE workshop. One or two classes from 6th to 8th

or 3^{rd} to 5^{th} were selected after discussing with teachers of the school for TiE workshop.

The team of RPs interacted with students and selected a chapter of English, Science or Mathematics from their curriculum. The lesson was explained through drama techniques. Students learned the teaching points in Play-way method.

Theatrical Lesson Plans, prepared by students were presented in front of all the students, teachers of the school, villagers and officers of Raj westPower Company on the last day of the workshop in the form of an interesting small skit.

The steps of our methodology were as follows-

- Select the lesson
- Select Teaching Points for Theatrical Lesson Plan
- Create proper Base Story to inculcate Teaching Points
- Include child songs, folk songs, folk dances and folk drama elements (Idioms, puzzles, games, story-telling) in the Base Story.
- Make Teaching Points clear through Base Story.
- Divide the whole story into different scenes
- Give important directions for presentation of TLP
- Ensure the participation of all students of the class
- Presentation of Theatrical Lesson
- Connect the **TLP** with traditional class room teaching

(For Community Awareness)

BNKVS liked to expand the Theatre in Education Program in such a way that it could be an effective device to educate community on various issues. So, by continuing the TiE for School Children we focused on community education through theatre.

A team of Resource Persons identified the community group by surveying and discussing with C.S.R. authorities of Raj WestPower Limited. Theatre Groups or Drama groups were formed with rural youths on various social issues/problems which dampen the progress of the society, Barmer as well as Rajasthan. The process of identifying and discussing an issue, scripting it,

rehearsals for community shows were all in itself an educative process- a process which gradually grows into the young minds and they resultantly become ambassadors of the social message being portrayed.

The new thoughts invade into the families, evoke curiosity and thus pave the way towards a social change.

The group performed the performance in front of villagers. A few questions were also asked to audience which was related to the message of the play.
